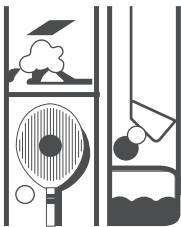

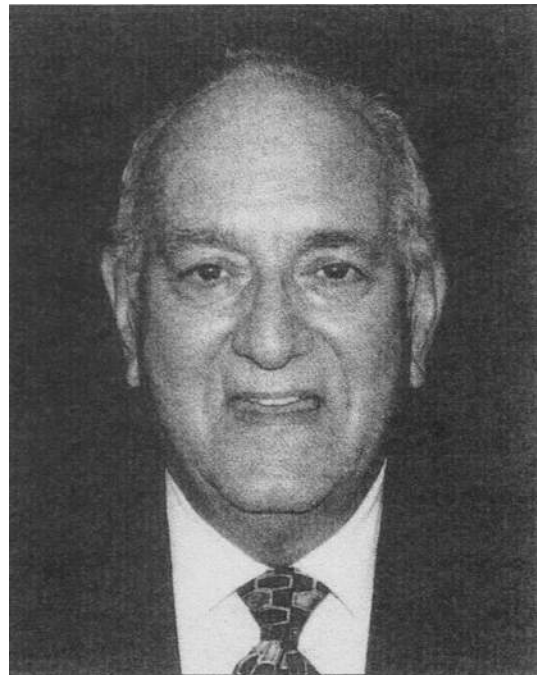


He served in the National Guard from 1950 -1952 and transferred to the Army Reserve for seven years.

HELPING THE OLDER PET AGE

Just like their human counterparts, as animals age they are less able to cope with changes in temperature and should be kept warm when it's cold and cool and hydrated when it's hot. Moderate exercise is also good. As there are no laws regulating "senior"

pet foods, check with your vet before introducing a new food. Being overweight can stress an older animal's joints, so be careful with diet and those table scraps. Like humans with Alzheimer's, both dogs and cats can get Cognitive Dysfunction Syndrome (CDS).

Of course, our bond with our pets strengthens as they grow older and it's hard to let go. There are serious diseases that could be treated if they help the animal's quality and length of life and are cost-effective for the owner vs. going nowhere with a pet that is in constant pain with a short life expectancy. It's up to the animal's owner to determine if their pet is not acting normally – not playing or interacting, staring at walls, being lackluster. Veterinarians are very sensitive to euthanasia and many will give the pet a mild sedative prior to the final injection. And while the animal's owner is feeling strong emotion about making such a heart-wrenching decision, that person is someone who really cares about their pet and who has given deep thought to the matter of ending life.

Limestone is being applied as needed. The green and white stakes will remain on tees and greens slopes to avoid traffic damage.

COOKING

February 14th is Valentines Day and, as the old saying goes, the way to someone's heart is through his or her stomach! And we're ready! Who needs Cupid when we have these delectable goodies, guaranteed to melt their hearts!

Turkey Milanese

- 1 lb. sliced mushrooms
- 2 tbs. butter
- 1 cup turkey gravy
- 1 tsp. fresh rosemary
- 3/4 cup all-purpose flour
- 2 large eggs
- 1-1/2 cups panko crumbs
- 1/2 cup grated Parmesan
- 4 (1/2"-thick) slices cooked turkey breast
- 1/4 cup canola oil

In a large skillet over medium-high heat, cook mushrooms in butter 10 min. or until browned and pan is dry, stirring often. Stir in gravy and rosemary, let simmer 2 min.

Place flour on wax paper, season with salt and pepper. Beat eggs with 1 tbs. water in pie plate. Combine panko crumbs and Parmesan on separate piece of wax paper. Coat each turkey slice with seasoned flour, shake off excess. Dip into eggs, then dredge in panko mixture to coat. Heat oil in a large skillet over medium-high heat, add turkey and cook 2 min. or until browned, turning once. Drain on paper towels. Serve with gravy and a salad.

Prosciutto-Wrapped Chicken with Garlic and Herb Cheese, with Garlic Spinach

- Olive oil, for drizzling
- Salt and pepper
- 2 cloves garlic, chopped
- 4 pieces boneless, skinless chicken breast, no tenders
- 1 wheel 5.4 ounce Boursin garlic and herb cheese
- 4 slices Prosciutto di Parma
- 1/2 lemon
- 12 ounces stemmed spinach or kale

Preheat oven to 350 degrees.

Butterfly the chicken breasts by cutting a slit horizontally through each piece - don't cut all the way - and opening it up. Season them with salt and pepper, and place 1/4 of the cheese in the center of each breast. Close the flap and then wrap each breast with a slice of prosciutto.

Heat a large skillet over medium-high heat with olive oil, a turn of the pan. Add chicken and brown on each side. Place lemon in pan, cut-side down, and transfer to oven for 7 - 8 minutes. Remove chicken to plate and cover to keep warm. Remove the lemon from pan. Add a bit more oil, a turn of the pan, and wilt in spinach or kale, season with salt, pepper and

garlic. Place greens on plate, top with chicken and douse everything with lemon juice.

Chocolate Cream Pie

- 1 refrigerated piecrust
- 1 cup milk
- 3 tbsb. flour
- 1 tbsb. unsweetened cocoa powder
- 1 cup sugar
- 3 large egg yolks
- 2 tbsb. butter
- 1 tsp. vanilla
- 1/4 tsp. kosher salt

Preheat oven to 450 degrees. Roll out dough on a lightly floured surface to fit 9" pie pan. Place in pie plate, trim edges. Prick bottom with a fork, line shell with foil and fill with beans or pie weights. Bake 10 - 12 min. or until golden. Cool. Heat milk in a small saucepan. In another pan, mix flour, cocoa and sugar. Beat egg yolks, add to flour mixture. Slowly add hot milk. Cook over medium heat 5 min., stirring. Once mixture starts to bubble, cook 2 min. more. Remove from heat, stir in butter, vanilla and salt. Pour filling into crust, chill 45 min.

Cinnamon Baked Apples

- 1-1/2 tbsb. cold butter, diced
- 1-1/2 tbsb. dark brown sugar
- 1/4 tsp. cinnamon
- Pinch of salt
- 2 small apples (such as Fuji), rinsed and dried
- 1/2 cup granola
- Ice cream

Preheat oven to 375 degrees. In a small bowl, mash together the butter, brown sugar, cinnamon and salt with a fork.

With a sharp paring knife or melon baller, core the apples to hollow out the middles. Do not go all the way through. Place the apples in a small casserole dish or pie tin, and fill each one evenly with the brown sugar mixture. Bake 30 to 40 minutes until tender. Let rest 5 minutes before serving. Top with your favorite granola and serve with a scoop of ice cream.

The bidding went:

was in a notrump game making three or four, and some were in 5♣.

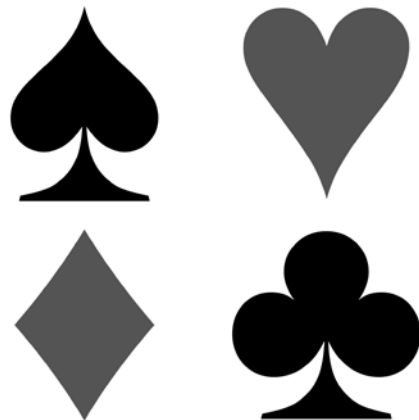
Partner gave me 100% of the blame for not finding a more original and forcing rebid like 2NT or 3♣ instead of 2♣.

His hand:

♠AK107 ♥Q85 ♦72 ♣10863.

Must I really bear all the blame?

Presumed guilty,
Roger Dunn, Montreal QC



Hi, Roger,

The title of a novel by John Grisham would more accurately reflect my opinion of the degree of blame on this issue: "Presumed Innocent"!

In a majority of suit auctions, the most important bid is the third one! Consider how little information is provided by the first two bids. 1♦ shows three or more diamonds, usually four or more (more than 95% of the time, if all of the statisticians who assaulted one of my previous utterances on this topic are correct), with 12–21 points, balanced or unbalanced. The 1♠ response shows four or more spades, 6 or more points, balanced or unbalanced.

At this point, neither player has done anything definitively to bracket his values to a meaningful level. In auctions such as this, the opening bidder's next call becomes critical. Consider the following auctions:

| <i>Opener</i> | <i>Responder</i> |
|---------------|------------------|
| 1♦ | 1♠ |
| 2♠/3♠/4♠ | |
| 1♦ | 1♠ |
| 2♦/3♦ | |
| 1♦ | 1♠ |
| 1NT/2NT | |

In each case, opener has limited his values to a range of no more than 3 points and has effectively designated his partner captain for the remainder of the auction. Let's get back to your auction of 1♦–1♠; 2♣.

This "third-suit rebid" defines opener's hand as somewhere between the worst possible opening bid up to values not quite enough for a game-forcing jump shift. Therefore, 12–18 points. Although this rebid is not forcing, responder should be aware that opener could hold a near jump shift, and should strain to find a second bid, holding as much as 8 or 9 points.

Your hand was nowhere near a game force, and 2♣ would be the only action I would consider. Responder, with 9 HCP and four-card club support, has a simple raise to 3♣. If you are minimum, you will know what to do. If you have extras, you will also know what to do. On this hand, 3NT would be a fairly routine conclusion.

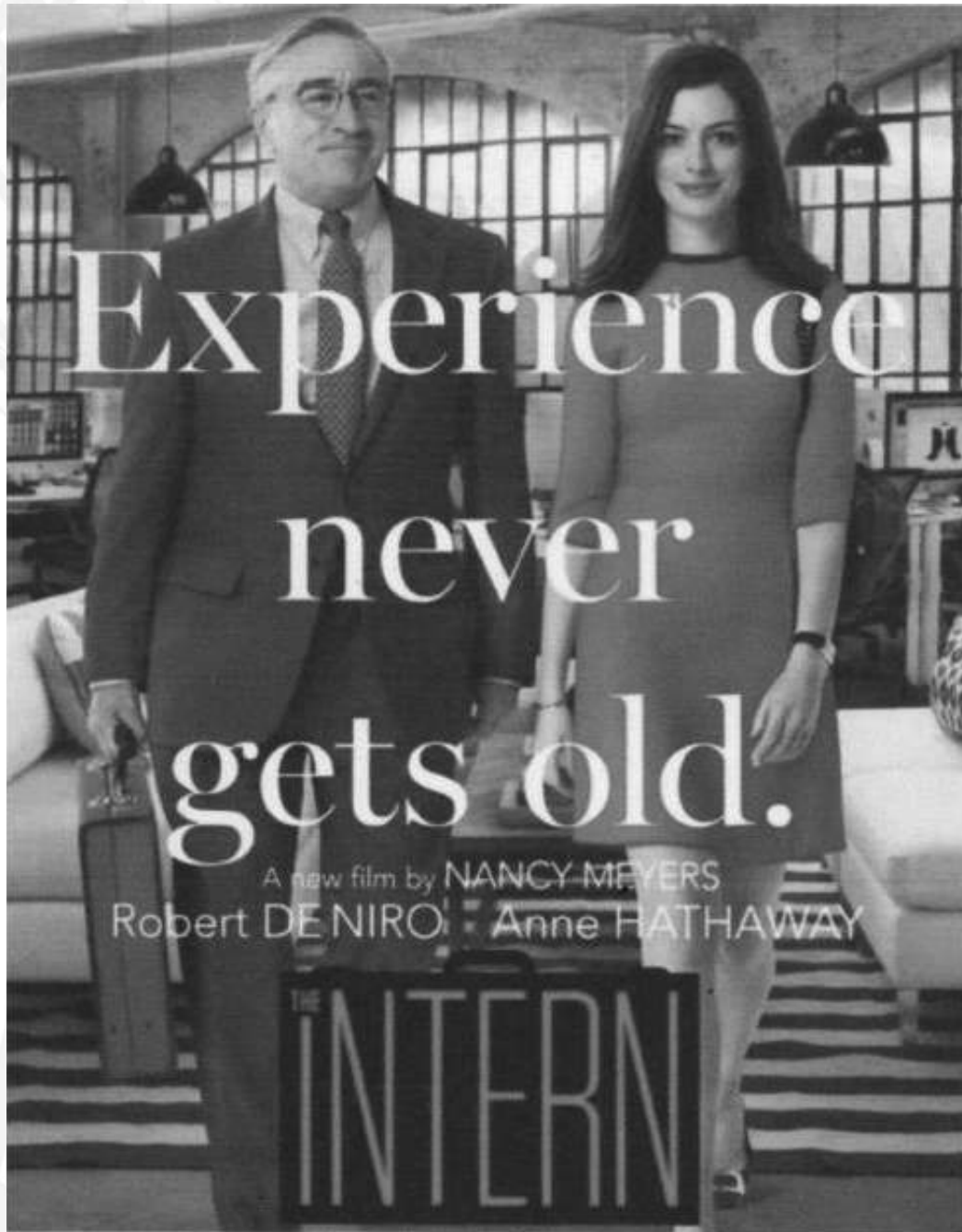

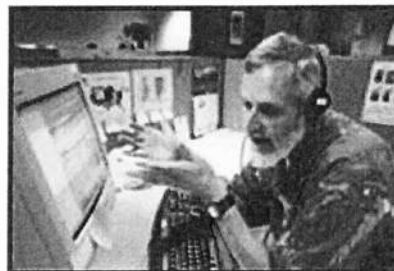

The City's purchase of a postal distribution center at the end of last year on a 27-acre site at the corner of Dykes Road and Pines Boulevard has allowed the City to incur a \$5.7 million profit upon its sale. The developer's plans transforms the post office building into a modern commercial and retail space, and adds 120 single family homes. This not only brings new revenue into our City, but also gives current and new residents the opportunity to purchase single family homes and shop at the same location. We also are all watching with excitement as our Civic and Cultural Center continues to be built, taking shape.

In addition to our internal growth, the municipal boundaries for the City also grew by approximately 60 acres when the annexation of the former Broward County Women's Correction Institute parcel became official. The City of Pembroke Pines now consists of approximately 22,237 acres or 34.8 square miles.

More information on these and other various issues, along with a glimpse at what will be happening in our future, will all be discussed at my annual State of the City Address on Monday, February 24, 2016. It will be held at 7PM at City Hall in the Commission Chambers, 10100 Pines Boulevard, Pembroke Pines, FL 33026. I look forward to seeing everyone at the meeting and sharing ideas.

This is also the time of year that our Pembroke Pines Charter School System's admissions lottery is underway, now through March 20, 2016. ## **BROWARD COUNTY COMMISSIONER, BEAM FURR**

It's February, and that means our Florida state legislators have returned to Tallahassee. As you know, the Broward County Commission is directly responsible for governing many

of the public services that our residents rely on, such as our regional libraries, parks, port, airports, transit, and human services just to name a few. However, much of the work that we do on behalf of Broward County must be accomplished in conjunction with our partners at the city, state and federal levels of government. This requires the County to put forward a list of annual legislative priorities, which guides our intergovernmental affairs team in Tallahassee and Washington DC. Today, I wish to share with you some

of Broward County's state legislative priorities for the 2016 session.

## **Broward County's 2016 State Legislative Priorities**

### • **PROHIBITION OF OIL OR GAS DRILLING**

This legislation would make it clear that any unincorporated areas within Broward County could not be used for oil or gas drilling without the approval of the local authority. Current legislation is clear on local approval within municipalities, but there is a lack of clarity for areas that are unincorporated. I support legislation clarifying that no oil or gas permit may be issued unless a county approves the application for oil or gas drilling projects within its jurisdiction.

### • **BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES**

All too often persons in our communities suffering from mental illness or other health issues affecting their behavior may not have appropriate treatment for their condition. Worse yet, they are sometimes shunted into the criminal and juvenile justice systems that are not designed for treatment of their condition. Therefore, we support legislation that provides increased access to behavioral health services, ensures effective treatment and outcomes for individuals and families within their

communities, and diverts individuals with a behavioral health diagnosis from the criminal and juvenile justice systems.

### • **CHILDCARE DEVELOPMENT ASSOCIATES**

Those of you who have grandchildren will appreciate my whole-hearted support of legislation that will ensure adequate teacher preparation in all publicly-funded early learning programs. This legislation would require each lead teacher to have a Child Development Associate degree within five years of enactment and 20 hours of annual professional development.

## **Appropriations Requests**

### • **BEACH RENOURISHMENT FUNDING**

We support increased funding for beach nourishment and inlet management projects through the Department of Environmental Protection Local Government Funding Assistance Program. Specifically, the Board of County Commissioners support funding for three ongoing projects:

Broward County's Segment II Beach Renourishment project. The Segment

II project (the section of beach that runs from Port Everglades north to the Hillsboro Inlet) has a total construction budget of \$44 million, and I'm pleased to report that construction began in January of this year.

Broward County's Segment III Beach Renourishment project. The Segment III project (the section of beach that runs from Port Everglades south to the Miami-Dade County Line) is still in the design phase, and Broward County requests that the state provides its share of the funds required to complete the design phase in this year's budget.

Port Everglades Sand Bypass project. The Sand Bypass project will capture sand that drifts south from Fort Lauderdale at Port Everglades for use on the beaches of Segment III and other points south. We are supporting legislation that will provide the funding for this.

### • **COMMUNITY CARE FOR THE ELDERLY**

We support increased funding for the Community Care for the Elderly Program within the Florida Department of Elder Affairs. There is a current waitlist of 1,215 functionally impaired elderly residents who need these

services.

### • HOMELESSNESS

There are presently in Florida 28 coalitions that are coordinating agencies dealing with the problem of homelessness in Florida. I am supporting legislation that would provide full funding for these coalitions. Also, I support full funding for the state of Florida Office on Homelessness. If this kind of legislation is passed, then local partners can focus on their mission of permanently rehousing the homeless.

## Legislative Proposals

### • SOLAR ENERGY

There is in existence a policy called "net metering". Net metering means that FPL customers who connect approved, renewable generation systems such as solar panels to the electric grid to buy and sell electricity to FPL. When you generate electricity from your solar array for your home or business, it reduces the amount of energy you purchase from FPL. It also lowers your monthly electricity bills. If your system produces more energy than you need, the excess power may be sold back to FPL's

grid. That amount of energy is deducted from your monthly bill or credited toward a future bill in the same calendar year. We want to make sure that this continues. We want to protect this benefit and promote its expansion.

### • ALTERNATIVE FUEL VEHICLES AND CHARGING INFRASTRUCTURE

We support legislative initiatives to expand the use of electric vehicles and other alternative fuel vehicles, including hybrid, hydrogen fuel cell, and clean diesel vehicles. We also support the expansion of electric vehicle charging infrastructure.

**Broward County Property Appraiser Lori Parrish Answers Your Questions...**

#### **"The 2016 Homestead Renewal and Change Order Card!"**

Dear Lori:

I filed for Homestead Exemption last year at one of your Community Outreach Events. I just received a mailing from your office with a newsletter and change card. Do I have to re-file in 2016 to keep this tax-saving exemption?

J. S., Hollywood, FL (via email)

After your initial application for the Homestead Exemption has been approved, it automatically renews each year unless there is a change of ownership or eligible use of the property. In January our office mailed 364,471 Homestead Renewal Notice and "Change-Cards" to all Homesteaded properties. This card allows property owners to verify the status, use, and ownership of the property have not changed. Florida law requires the property owner to notify our office of any change in permanent residency, use or status which would affect an exemption. If anyone named on the Homestead Exemption has died, you must report it to our office to avoid potential penalties. The Homestead Exemption of a deceased person must be removed in the year immediately following the individual's passing. Homestead Exemptions do not transfer to family members and do not remain with the property after the Homesteaded owner passes away. By law, you MUST notify us if any portion of the property has been rented, or if you are claiming a Homestead (or other residency based) exemptions on any other property anywhere.

Failure to report a change of ownership, use, death of a Homesteaded owner or Homesteaded trust beneficiary, divorce or separation may result in a costly back tax lien, plus penalties and interest, for continuing to improperly receive the benefits of the expired exemption. State law allows for a back tax for as many as ten years, plus payment of substantial penalty and annual interest (50% of the unpaid taxes for each year and pay interest at a rate of 15% per year). If there are NO changes to the use and/or ownership of the property, simply keep the card as your receipt verifying you were automatically renewed for another year. However, if there are changes, please mark the Change Card accordingly and return it to our office.

If you recently moved to this property, the exemption from your previous residence does NOT transfer to your new home - you must apply for a new exemption. If you received this card at your home address, but the name printed below is the former owner or not printed on the card, you must apply for a new exemption in your own name to receive tax savings. 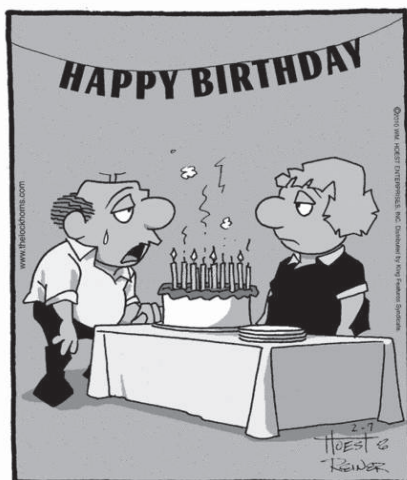

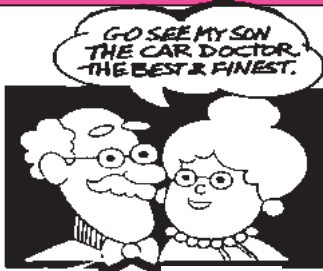
